

the initiative...

a bit of history

The Beltline has endured line-ups in the streets as people commute the homeless triangle seeking out emergency services and drop-in meals.

what's proposed

- programs that get people off the streets
- a drug and alcohol free choice
- a stable setting to build new lives
- an affordable alternative to homelessness
- approximately 200 apartments in new 10th Avenue highrise
- an active streetscape, retail and program spaces
- repurpose the building west of Centre Street for commercial use

likely consequences for the Beltline

- no more line-ups in streets
- 11th Avenue shelter permanently relocated
- drop-in facilities discontinued
- improved pedestrian environment at 10th, 11th Avenues and Centre Street
- healthy reintegration into the community
- more vibrant street life around Mustard Seed

We want, in the end, for this to **fit** the **revitalization** of the community.
